
Vashon-Maury Island Garden Club History













The Vashon Heritage Museum stands on the ancestral lands of the sxwəbabs or Swift Water People, who inhabited Vashon-Maury Island for millennia.

The Donation Land Claim Act encouraged large numbers of settlers to claim land, even before the Medicine Creek Treaty of 1854 extinguished Native claims to it.

The sxwəbabs were imprisoned on Fox Island during the Puget Sound Treaty Wars by the Territorial government and later relocated onto the Puyallup Reservation.

We acknowledge the people of the Puyallup Tribe whose stewardship of and relationship with Vashon-Maury Island continues today. We commit to amplify the voices of Indigenous People, making space for them to tell their own story, both past and present, in our exhibits and programs.

Sharing Our Passion

Whether it's called the Peach Festival, the Harvest Festival, the Vashon Island Festival or the Strawberry Festival, the Garden Club has been celebrating with the rest of the island — with floats, Flower Fairs, even a Drill Team! 








Flower Arranging

Flower arranging was such a focus in the earlier days of the Club that in 1952, members were required to bring three horticultural specimens or flower arrangements to each meeting, with a fine of 25 cents per arrangement if they did not! The Vashon-Maury Island Garden Club belonged to the Washington State Federation of Garden Clubs, whose conferences included elaborate flower arranging competitions, as did our local Flower Fairs and Festivals.







Memory Garden Dedication

When Brian Jorgensen met a premature death this spring, his Vashon Elementary classmates wanted to build a memorial to him, and felt it should be a living, growing thing.

After much discussion, they decided upon a memorial garden, and pitched in with work and contributions. The Vashon Garden Club was approached for ideas, and contributed not only ideas, but also plants and funds for materials.

As word of the project spread in the community, help came in the form of labor, tractor and backhoe work, fill dirt and other materials and contributions from parents of the children and others.

Although the project is not completed, a dedication was held September 11, with four of Brian's classmates speaking. A soem written by Brian was read as a part of the service.




